

Governor John Bel Edwards issued Proclamation Number 33JBE2020 effective from 5:00 PM on Monday, March 23, 2020 to Monday, April 13, 2020 mandating reduced operations in order to minimize contact with members of the public and further directing all individuals within the state to “stay-at-home” unless performing an essential activity. In order to comply with the requirements of the Proclamation the following measures are being instituted for Police Jury operations effective immediately:

- Courthouse and other facilities remain closed to the public
- Police Jury Administrative office will be staffed from 8am-1pm Monday-Friday
- Highway Department will be staffed with essential personnel only. Hours of operation will be 7:30 am-Noon, Monday-Friday, Employees will be available for after hour call out emergencies. Only essential services will be provided while Proclamation is in effect.
- Landfill will be open from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm Monday through Friday and 8-Noon Saturday
- Solid Waste Collection activities will be limited to dumpster sites only. House calls will be suspended until further notice.
- HELP Agency transportation services are available via scheduling (251-5138)

Please note that any full-time employees considered non-essential and sent home will be compensated. The COVID-19 Emergency is unlike any event local governments have faced before. All efforts are being made to serve the interest of the public, comply with law and protect our employees. The above measures are subject to change pending further orders from Federal or State Authorities and changes in the local situation.
